




REVENUE BY TYPE

Highlighting our Longest Standing Volunteer: George Shields



Did you know that The Speech & Stuttering Institute would likely not be here today, or in fact have not been

created, if it was not for the dedication and drive of George Shields? George is a devoted East York Barbershopper and founding chairman of the Harmonize for Speech Fund. It was George's vision and recognition of the need for an organization for those with speech challenges that helped create SSI (formerly the Speech Foundation of Ontario). In 1977, the Speech Foundation of Ontario was established with

George's assistance to foster the development of innovative therapy programs and to support education and research in the field of communication disorders.

In the early 1980's, with George's tireless fundraising efforts, the Speech Foundation purchased and equipped a house at 93 Grenville Street and launched its first clinical program. Since then George has remained very active as a donor, fundraiser, former chair and current vice-chair of our Board of Directors. In fact, George has rarely missed a meeting in the past 40 years!

We are not the only benefactor of George's kind generosity; George was honoured with the Order of Canada for being "outstanding in his contributions to make life better for the "frequently forgotten", the speech disabled, giving incalculable hours of his working and leisure time and making both personal and financial sacrifices so that this group, which comprises an estimated eight percent of the Canadian population, can speak out and be heard."

Our appreciation for this amazing man cannot be overstated. We are honoured to have him on our board and incredibly grateful for his dedication to all those with communication challenges.

RESEARCH & EDUCATION

The Speech & Stuttering Institute is currently engaged in a province-wide training initiative for clinicians within Ontario's 31 Preschool Speech and Language Programs. These professional education workshops, based on proposed care pathways developed by SSI subject matter expert clinicians, focus on assessment and treatment of both motor speech disorders and stuttering in preschool-aged children. This training initiative is also the focus of a unique program evaluation strategy that we developed to monitor training program outcomes.

Together, SSI Research Scientist Dr. Elissa Flagg, PhD, and former Executive Director Dr. Robert Kroll, PhD, presented a seminar at the 2017 ASHA Convention titled "How To Tell If Your Workshop Is Working: Lessons From Evaluating Two SLP Training Programs". Over 14,000 Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists from around the world attended ASHA 2017, which created an excellent opportunity to share our research with a diverse audience of colleagues. This line of research has helped us to monitor how specialized training can increase clinicians' confidence and skills, and has also provided us with a better understanding of service delivery for preschoolers with speech and stuttering disorders in Ontario.

In addition to the Ministry of Child & Youth Services funded training, The Speech & Stuttering Institute's senior staff continued to train professionals by presenting motor speech and fluency workshops at the Institute to speech language pathologists from our local community.

CLINICAL SPEECH PROGRAMS

We provide individual speech therapy for children. Therapy develops the child's control of the physical movements required to produce speech in functional words and phrases the child needs to acquire. Therapy activities are designed to provide children with many opportunities to develop and practice new speech skills, while also supporting language and early literacy development.

Our team of speech-language pathologists has extensive clinical and teaching experience in the following areas:

- Speech production difficulties
- Articulation and speech sound disorders
- Motor speech impairments
- Late talkers
- Childhood Apraxia of Speech (CAS)

CLINICAL STUTTERING PROGRAMS

Stuttering is a chronic neurological condition that usually begins between the ages of 3 and 6 and often persists through adulthood.

We provide a comprehensive range of services to individuals who stutter and their families. We offer parent-based programs for preschoolers, individual and group therapy for school aged children and intensive courses for teens and adults. We teach a variety of strategies and techniques to help our clients deal with the physical and psychological effects of stuttering and become successful communicators.

Our 3-week Fluency Plus intensive program is the only specialized and intensive treatment program for stuttering in the Greater Toronto Area and one of only a handful of such treatments worldwide.

We train our colleagues across Ontario to apply the principles of these care pathways, thus ensuring the highest quality of care to children and their families in this program.

The stuttering program is the only specialized and intensive treatment program for stuttering in the greater Toronto area and one of only a handful of such treatment centres worldwide.

THE SPEECH & STUTTERING INSTITUTE HELPS CHILDREN

Clinicians at the institute are designated leaders in Ontario at developing treatment approaches for children with motor speech and stuttering disorders.
